Effective January 1, 2012, the California Transparency in Supply Chains Act of 2010 (SB 657, which adds to California Civil Code Section 1714.43) will require retailers doing business in the State of California to provide information regarding their efforts to eradicate slavery and human trafficking in their supply chains. Vintners Distributors does not believe there is an appreciable risk of human trafficking or slavery corrupting our direct supply chain, which is located within the United States.
